People over the age of 40 represent 27% of the population in less developed countries—that's approximately **1.3 billion people** with deteriorating close-up vision who may be at risk of losing their livelihood.

Because so many developing countries are equatorial, RESTORING VISION also provides sunglasses to protect eyes from smoke, blowing dust, and harmful UV light.

RESTORING VISION is a non-profit resource that provides NEW readers and sunglasses to Samaritan groups who serve the vision needs of people worldwide who otherwise would have no access to glasses. Since starting in late 2003, we have provided more than 1 million pairs of glasses to over 250 groups serving 75 countries around the world.

This grass roots organization was founded by visionary, Mark Sachs after encountering tremendous need in third world countries. He teamed up with other caring individuals in the vision industry to offer new glasses for those in need at the lowest possible cost.
