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Adding Extra space to the Eyeglasses Inventory Duffle Bag

Introduction

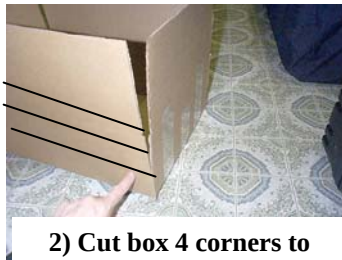
The Eyeglasses Inventory Duffle bags hold two Eyeglasses Inventory boxes. The duffle bag is within the maximum dimensions (62 linear inches) for checked baggage for both International and Domestic flights. When the bag is filled with 2 boxes and 320 eyeglasses the total weight is about 40 lbs. This means that for domestic flights you can add 10 more lbs and for international flights you can add 30 lbs. The purpose of this note is to describe how to make use of the additional space in the duffle bags. This document describes the addition of 2 thin boxes which can contain readers, sunglasses or other optical parts.

The Recommendation

There have been two versions of the Eyeglasses Inventory duffle bags. The older version is blank with no labeling while the newer version is labeled "Everest". Both bags have enough additional space for these boxes but the Everest bag has a bit more space. The space available is at least 2 additional inches on the side of the bag. That is why a standard box available from <http://www.uline.com/> was chosen to fill this space. It is part number S-4427 (18" x 12" x 6/4/2") available at this link: <http://www.uline.com/ProductDetail.asp?model=S-4427&ref=407> The following shows the thin box assembly procedure.



1) Seal the box bottom



2) Cut box 4 corners to the bottom fold line.



3) Fold all 4 flaps on bottom line



4) Both side flaps turned down.



5) Do 2 boxes and seal at top.



6) Insert first box into bag.



7) Push the box back into bag.



8) Insert 2nd box into bag.



9) And push it down.



10) Pull bag side over 2 boxes.



11) Zip the top and you are ready to go
